

# Frequently Asked Questions

## Group Category



### ★ What exactly is the Group Category?

The group category is open to all young people aged 3-18. This year our group category includes schools, youth groups and sibling or family groups. Whether the film is already made, you are still in school or now learning at home, this category is for you.

### ★ When do I have to get the film back to Childnet?

The cut off for entrants is **17:00 GMT on Monday 22nd June 2020**. We will not be able to enter any film that arrives after this date.

### ★ When will the winners be announced?

Winners will be announced on **Friday 3rd July 2020**.

### ★ How long must the film be?

All film entries must be 2 minutes or under. This time frame must include any credits you wish to add. It is advisable to keep credits to a minimum to avoid losing time for your film content and remember to add first names only!

### ★ How many people can be in a group?

Each group should contain between 2 and 8 people, including those behind the scenes.

### ★ How many entries can be submitted?

As long as they are from different film teams, schools/youth groups can enter as many as they like. Family groups can enter one per family.

### ★ What equipment should I use?

Everyone has different facilities and access to equipment. You could use anything from a camcorder to a mobile phone. It's the fantastic content that we will be looking for!

### ★ How do I send you my film?

Completed films and forms must be sent electronically (e.g. Dropbox or WeTransfer) to [film@childnet.com](mailto:film@childnet.com). **Remember the cut off is 5pm on Monday 22nd June 2020.**

**REMEMBER:** Educators or parents/carers should oversee all content throughout the process to ensure it meets the terms and conditions of the competition. They must also be responsible for entering the film into the competition. **When submitting a film make sure you have obtained and included media consent from all the people in the film group** (see the media consent form in your competition pack). If these are not submitted with your film and entry form, we won't be able to put it on our website.

### ★ What about adding music?

We can only accept films that contain original or royalty free music. Make sure that you have read our section on copyright before you include any music in your film.

### ★ What about adding images from an online game?

Unfortunately this will breach copyright so avoid using any images or footage of an online game as we won't be able to enter your film into the competition.
