

Challenge

- First you separate the jelly beans by colour into separate bowls.
- Next you add enough water to cover the jelly beans to all the bowls.
- 3. What you think might happen to the jelly beans after sitting in the water?
- Observe what is happening to the jelly beans as they are sitting in the water.
- Leave the jelly beans for a few hours and then come back to check them.
- 6. Take the jelly beans out of the water and observe the changes...
- Can you explain what has happened?

Resources

- 2 bags of jelly beans
- small bowls
- water

Take the Egg Drop Challenge!

Challenge

You are challenged to design and make a container to protect an egg from a high fall **OR** look at the designs on the next page and decide which of these would be best and why.

- Check that your adult is happy for you to use an egg before you start....
- Plan your idea an gather your materials first
- Build your container and place the egg inside.
- Drop the egg from somewhere high. (Be sure it's safe and an adult is with you.)
- After you drop it look and see if your egg cracked or remained intact.
- Remember to wash your hands after touching raw egg!
