Expectations

Attendance

- It is the parents'/carers duty to send their child to school regularly where they are of compulsory school age;
- It is the school's responsibility to record attendance and follow up absence;
- Discretion of the local authorities to use legal sanctions, including penalty notices and prosecution in court.
- Please email or ring the school to notify us of your child's absence.

What your child will need in school:

- Every day they should bring in their water bottle.
- Reading book and reading record book on their reading day .
- ALL clothing to be labelled including P.E. Kits/coats etc
- Coats for Autumn weather/hats/caps.
- Own pencil case (Years 4, 5 and 6).



Start of School Time

To continue to keep in line with government guidance, from Monday 4th September 2023, school will open from <u>8.40am</u> but children will be expected to be in class by 8.45am ready for learning. This means that there will be a 5-minute soft start and learning will begin at <u>8.45am</u>.

Please ensure that your child arrives in school on time and ready for their learning. School will finish at 3.15 pm.



Pen Licence

It is difficult to put an age on when a child should move from pencil to pen because every child is different. This year, we hope your child will move onto using a pen in most subjects. They will receive a class certificate and their first berol pen as a gift from the school.

Home Learning



Home Learning is set on the Year 3 Class Blog on a <u>Friday</u> and is due to be completed by the following Wednesday.

Weekly Spellings – these will be handed out at the beginning of each half term for a dictation test every Friday.

Reading – 10-15 minutes per day, parents to listen to child read and sign reading diary weekly.

Maths – Mathletics

Times tables Rockstars – please encourage your child to practise their times tables at least three times a week.

English – comprehension/research etc.

Additional homework – We will be sending additional homework if we feel your child will benefit with more practice on a specific concept of our learning.



The children will have P.E. on Wednesday and Friday. On your child's allocated PE Day, they will be required come to school in their PE Kit.

Lunchtime:





Please inform the school office via email in the morning of any changes to school pick up so that your child's class teacher will be informed. If you wish to speak to your child's class teacher, please make an appointment through the office.

If you wish your child to attend the After School Club, you need to book your place online using School Comms.

Mobile Phones

When you are bringing or collecting your child(ren) to/from school, please ensure that your mobile phone is turned off. It is an important time to talk and share with your child.

For those children in Year 5 and 6: if you wish for your child to have a mobile phone, this will need to be kept in his/her school bag and turned off. The school will not be held responsible if something happens to it or if it is lost.

Parking

Please note that Pope Paul Primary School takes the safety of our children very seriously.

Parents bringing children to school by car should park in a safe location but well away from the school car park, school entrance or in the area of zig zag or double yellow lines. We ask you not to park along Great Slades. Parents should not drive into the school car park to drop children off.

Walk to School
